Ministers Boissonnault, MacLeod, O'Regan and McNaughton,

- **Immigration fast-tracking**, including for hospitality and tourism professionals and students, and for priority regions such as Ukraine.
- Skills training and development enhancements for hospitality and tourism industries in partnership with trades, universities, and colleges.

We are also supportive of further lowering of border and travel restrictions as public health leaders identify new protocols to keep us safe in less restricted ways. On behalf of our business community, we remain tremendously grateful for the supports and relief programs so far and ask for these hardest hit businesses that you continue to allow them the flexibility to thrive.

Our last request is that as public leaders, we encourage you to support hospitality and tourism businesses in your community directly, in person. Please encourage all your elected associates to lead by example in bringing people back out for fun and recreation this spring and summer. We hope to see you in person, at our restaurants and patios, at our attractions and on the water soon!
