

### What are BIAs?

A Business Improvement Area (BIA) is an association of commercial property owners and tenants within a defined area who work in partnership with the City.

BIA's are catalysts for civic improvements & enhancing the business climate & quality of life of the neighbourhood:

- **Promotion** of the BIA
- Festivals and events
- Safety, security & crime prevention initiatives
- Maintaining Commercial Facades (Graffiti & poster removal)
- Strategic planning (Business recruitment, market studies)
- Advocate
- Capital Cost-share Programs (streetscape master-plans, mural projects)

## What is SafeTO?

SafeTO is the city's 10 year plan **advancing Community Safety** & Well-being by working collaboratively across sectors, communities and governments. It will drive **26 priority actions** across **7 strategic goals.** 

### SafeTO x DYBIA = SafeTObia

The Downtown Yonge Business Improvement Area (DYBIA) and SafeTO have partnered on a year long pilot project to address the **growing challenges of community safety and well-being in BIAs.**







Perceived safety: 3.02






























...The visibility of green vegetation plays an important role in increasing perceived safety in urban areas.




**SafeTObia will engage** with BIAs and key stakeholder across city departments to better understand the the issues to then explore solutions with participating BIAs.




SafeTObia Summit (Dec 2023)

### **165 Participants**


150 people registered


Majority of respondents' concerns centre on **substance use** and **increase of people experiencing homelessness** in or around their BIA
