### AN OPEN CALL FOR CANADIAN VISUAL ARTISTS

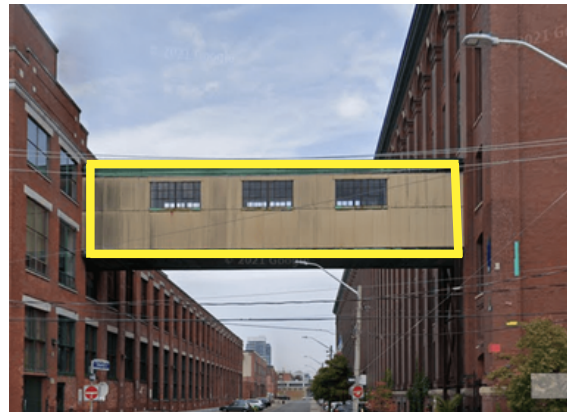

#### LOCATION SCOPE:

##### 67 Mowat Ave, Toronto, ON M6K 3E3

A south-facing bridge facade at Mowat Ave. (see the image on the right with the area outlined in yellow for the proposed mural). This facade is part of the Toronto Carpet Factory and King Dufferin Liberty Building. Located in the heart of the Liberty Village neighbourhood, this building has high visibility and great exposure.



The location is outlined in yellow.

#### WHAT WE ARE LOOKING FOR:

We are seeking expressions of interest from experienced visual artists or muralists to submit their bio/portfolio. Selected artist(s) will be chosen based on artistic merit, professional experience and capacity to complete the project. Please include a description of your vision for the mural and your submission should not exceed 5 pages (PDF/PPT format). This call is open to professional artists living in the GTA or the surrounding area. We encourage artists that are indigenous, people of colour, women, 2SLGBTQ+, people with disabilities, and members of other marginalized communities to apply.

#### BUDGET & TIMELINE

**\$7,500 (HST inclusive): Includes artist fees, all materials, and licenses/permits.**

**Selected Artist Notification: June 12th, 2024**

**Mural Design Creation: June 17 - June 28, 2024**

**Rendering Approvals from the LVBIA: July 1 - July 12, 2024**

**Mural Painting: July 22 - July 28, 2024**

**Plaque Design and Installation: By August 15, 2024**



## WHAT WE ARE LOOKING FOR:

We propose a dynamic and engaging mural for the Toronto Carpet Factory and King Dufferin Liberty building mural titled "**Journey Through Time: The Liberty Streetcar**". This concept celebrates the iconic Peter Witt streetcar as a symbol of the city's evolving journey, capturing the spirit of motion, connection, and community transformation over time. The design will weave together elements inspired by the streetcar's form and the lively interactions it has facilitated, that reflect the vibrant life of Liberty Village.

In this mural, the essence of the streetcar and its role in the city's history is captured through vibrant design and forms, inviting viewers into a visual narrative that celebrates community engagement. Figures and scenes inspired by life within and around the transit system will merge with these forms, portraying the diverse stories and faces of Toronto's population in a way that invites interpretation and interaction.

This concept pays homage to the vision of York Heritage founders Bob Eisenberg and Michael Cruickshank while exploring innovative visual techniques to capture the essence of the streetcar's legacy in a way that resonates with a wide audience. This mural aims to create a captivating, immersive experience that honours the past while looking toward the future of Liberty Village and Toronto's urban landscape.

## GENERAL INFO

- The art mural is in grant partnership with the City of Toronto, Liberty Village BIA, Toronto Carpet Factory and the King Dufferin Liberty Building. Terms of the grant require the proposed design to be approved by all 3 parties; all must be acknowledged and their logos appear on the final mural.
- Designs may include text, diagrams or pictures but may not use offensive images, language or commercial slogans.
- Moral rights of the artwork will remain with the artist. LV BIA and Toronto Carpet Factory will work with the selected artist on copyrights and its use of images for promotional purposes.
